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Entre4all is an Erasmus+ project with the aim of producing training materials and a tool kit to enable people with disabilities to acquire entrepreneurial and digital skills, and to set up their own social enterprise.

People with disabilities often face considerable challenges on the labour market. This project builds on the fact that self-employment rates among people with disabilities are increasing. Why? People with disabilities are looking to become more independent, to improve their work-life balance and to enter the labour market on their own terms.

Entre4all develops training materials and a TOOL KIT to enable people with disabilities to acquire entrepreneurial and digital skills, and set up their own social enterprise.

The main project target group is young adults with disabilities, as well as adult educators and trainers, social workers and carers, and other experts as indirect target groups.



has 5 work packages:

1.

Social Entrepreneurship Index Partners create a map of social entrepreneurship initiatives and conduct a survey to assess the needs of trainers and people with disabilities with regard to training in social entrepreneurship.

2.

Entre4all Back Pack  
The backpack will include materials and resources for adult educators to enable them to conduct training in social entrepreneurship for people with disabilities.

3.

Entre4all Web Portal and Mobile App  
A web portal will be developed where the training course materials will be online, badges can be received after the achievement of modules and an online discussion form.

4.

Entre4all Tool Kit  
The tool kits provides guidelines on setting up Entre4all community centres, where the courses about social entrepreneurship for people with disabilities will be carried out and synergies with strategic partner organisations will be developed.

5.

Entre4all Grassroots initiative  
The Entre4all grassroots initiative consists of a campaign to promote social entrepreneurship among people with disabilities, and the development and transferability of Entre4all community centres in the long-term.
